- We need new value-added products to buy Canadian and export (including dual-use products)




Combining Canada's strengths with new directions will drive innovation, prosperity, and national security


Align our clear advantages on natural resources and key sectors like health and education with the realities and opportunities of new technologies and national security imperatives.
